From the revised guidelines in the implementation of the Department of Labor and Employment under the Integrated Livelihood and Emergency Programs (DILEEP), Series of 2017, Department Order No. 173 Section 1 states that this program particularly seeks to contribute to poverty reduction and reduce vulnerability to risks of the poor, vulnerable, and either through (1)marginalized workers, transitional emergency employment; and (2) promotion of livelihood and entrepreneurship. It has two component programs, namely: (1) DOLE Integrated Livelihood Program (DILP) otherwise known as the KABUHAYAN Program; and (2) Emergency Employment (EEP) otherwise known as the TULONG Program PANGHANAPBUHAY SA ATING DISADVANTAGED/DISPLACED WORKERS (TUPAD) Program.

A total number of 3,852 beneficiaries in which 408 belong to **Roxas Night Market vendors**, 410 from those affected by **ASF**, 2,985 from **PUJ drivers**, and 49 from the **LGBT Community**, were able to avail the said program with the allotted budget of 45,761,760.00 pesos from the Department of Labor and Employment downloaded to the City Government of Davao for the 30 days work in which the beneficiaries will be receiving 396 per day.
